





INNOVATIVE OCEANIA NEPALI SPORTS MEET 2023 CANBERRA

PRESS RELEASE

APRIL 19, 2023

It is a great pleasure to announce that the fifth edition of the Oceania Nepali Sports Meet (ONSM) tournament concludes with HUGE SUCCESS.

The tournament, held from Friday 7 to Monday 10 April 2023 in Canberra, the capital city of Australia, was coordinated by the ONSM Coordination Committee that has members from across Australia and New Zealand.

The event, popularly dubbed as "Nepali mini-Olympics" within the Nepalese diaspora in the Oceania region was a fun-filled 4-day long sporting extravaganza where over 700 Athletes from across Australia and New Zealand competed in 10 sports, including #GOLF, #BADMINTON, #TENNIS, #TABLETENNIS, #5KMRUN, #SWIMMING, #BASKETBALL, #VOLLEYBALL, #SOCCER, #CRICKET.

Following are the high lights:

- 1. Longest running campaign to host the event in Canberra since 2018
- 2. First time the ONSM is exposed to national stage. Credit goes to Mr Craig Foster, AM for his support and graceful presence in the award ceremony.
- 3. First time, a member of the Indigenous community participated and performed acknowledgement of country and played traditional instrument Didgeridoo on the opening and closing ceremony
- 4. Swimming was included for the first time in the list of sports
- 5. Title sponsors were secured for all 10 sports
- 6. Large contingent of second-generation athletes took part in the tournament including a second-generation title sponsor for Basketball
- 7. Athletes from nine jurisdictions (eight States and Territories of Australia and New Zealand) participated in the events
- 8. Largest contingent to date participated from Tasmania and Western Australia
- 9. A six-digit budget needed for the first time to host the event
- 10. Live streaming of events for the first time
- 11. photography and videography full coverage of the event at all 10 sports venues
- 12. Two jurisdictions, NSW and ACT have athletes participating in all 10 sports
- 13. NSW secured the highest number of medals followed by VIC and ACT

Friday (7th April) the first day of the tournament saw heavy rain across Canberra so the cricket game scheduled at Lyneham grounds was called off due to wet condition. The Lawn Tennis scheduled in Western Creek was also cancelled but we were able to secure an indoor venue at Tennis Australia in Lyneham.

Adverse weather conditions and overwhelming participation that forced us to change few venues in the eleventh hours was challenging to manage but the agile team ACT promptly adapted to the evolving situations and held the opening ceremony at the greyhound Race Course with a BANG in the evening of the first day. The spectacular opening was witnessed by 600+ players, guests and performers. H.E. Mr Kailash Raj Pokharel graced the opening ceremony as the Chief Guest.

Saturday (8th April) the second day of the tournament saw commencement of the most of the sports as the rain cleared in Canberra. The cricket resumed its game at the scheduled grounds in Lyneham. The Lawn Tennis moved to the scheduled venue at Western Creek in the afternoon after the indoor game in the morning. Additionally, Badminton and Soccer games commenced at AIS, Golf in Gungahlin, Volleyball in Wanniassa, and Basketball in Tuggeranong.

On the sideline in the evening of the second day, the Special General Meeting was held in Flynn. The ONSM Coordination Committee (OCC) members and Sports Coordinators attended the SGM where closing ceremony, the next ONSM host in 2025, issues required to be tabled and addressed before the upcoming Annual General Meeting (AGM) in July including challenges of ONSM for its sustainability and handover process to the next host were discussed.

Sunday (9th April) the third day of the tournament saw continuation of the sports started on the second day. Additionally, Table Tennis and Swimming commenced at Kingston and Gungahlin respectively. By the evening of the third day, all the games, except the Cricket concluded.

Monday (10th April) the fourth day of the tournament saw the semi-final and final games of the Cricket. Additionally in the morning, 5KM run was conducted at the beautiful Lake Burley-Griffin.

The incredible tournament culminated in the evening of the fourth day with a closing ceremony that featured gala dinner, medals distribution and cultural performances including acknowledgment of country and Didgeridoo instrumental by a member of the local indigenous community in Canberra. The ceremony was attended by former Socceroo's captain Mr Craig Foster, AM, H.E. Mr Kailash Raj Pokharel Nepalese Ambassador to Australia, Mr David Smith MP, and Mr Peter Cain MLA. Other distinguished guests included Mr Ben Thurley INF Australia, Mr Ashish Devkota President Australia-Nepal Friendship Society and Mr Nanda Gurung, President NRNA Australia.

It is fair to say that the ONSM 2023 tournament overall is a HUGE SUCCESS and that it achieved new heights and reached to national stage in Australia. The success story of the tournament will have rippling effect to reverberate and enthuse other multicultural communities to organise similar sporting events, drawing players, families and friends from across Australia and overseas. Sports unite people and communities. So, this will have a longer-term implication as the sporting events such as the ONSM has potential to bring together diverse ethnic groups and cross-cultural communities from across the Oceania region, promote community harmony, and enhance multiculturism in the region. It is envisaged that, in the long run, this could also generate significant revenue supporting local businesses and creating local jobs.

The Nepalese community is vibrant and fast-growing but is relatively new. The ONSM is a unique initiative of its kind but is resource intensive and it brings a great deal of challenges. We are underresourced financially and lacking adequate support from the government mechanisms. There is the

tremendous opportunity available to reach out to multi-ethics communities through the means of sports and we would like to draw the attention of all level of the governments to provide support for its professional development and sustainability.

SUCCESS of ONSM 2023 was all possible with dedicated sports coordinators from team ACT and uncountable volunteers led by Adarsha Jung Pandey, ACT Coordinator, Mahesh Bashistha, Deputy ACT Coordinator and Raj Kumar KC Overall sports Coordinator (refer to Table 1 below for details). Their unconditional support and invaluable contribution are acknowledged. HUGE shout outs to the teamACT. Also, the help and support provided remotely by Jabin Shrestha and Nabin Rayamajhy of NSW on all IT related matters including management of online registration process and regular website update is noted and highly appreciated. Support and guidance provided by the OCC members are duly acknowledged. Outstanding contributions made by the patrons from the beginning to date was duly recognised.

The event was organised in partnerships with Australia-Nepal Friendship Society Inc. (ANFS) and in association with the Non-Resident Nepali Association (NRNA) Australia. The tournament was supported by Canberra-based Nepalese sporting Clubs including the Football (Soccer) Club, the Cricket Club, the Volleyball Club and the Badminton Club and many other local community organisations in the region. The support and contribution from the host and the partners organisations spread across Australia and New Zealand is duly acknowledged (refer to Table 2 below for details).

Innovative Associates provided financial support as the tournament sponsor. Without this and 10 title sponsors for each sport, organising a mega-even of this nature is impossible. Financial support from all sponsors is duly acknowledged (refer to Table 3 below for details).

Similarly, the support and contribution provided by Media partners is duly acknowledged (refer to Table 4 below for details).

Overall medals tally in Table 5 shows that NSW is a clear tournament winner with 49 medals. The second place goes to VICTORIA with 22 medals while the third place goes to the host ACT with 20 medals. Medals tally for each sport is provided in Table 6. The winners and Runner-ups details for team sports (Basketball, cricket, Soccer & Volleyball) is provided in Table 7. The winners,1st Runner-ups and 2nd Runner-ups details for individual sports is provided in Table 8 (Badminton, Lawn tennis & 5Km Run) and Table 9 (Golf, TT & Swimming). List of Founding members / patrons and State / Country Coordinators is provided in Table 10.

Started as the Nepalese Interstate Sports Meet (NISM) for the first three editions (2013 Sydney, 2014 Melbourne, 2016 Brisbane) and re-branded as the Oceania Nepali Sports Meet (ONSM) from the fourth edition (2018 Sydney), this sports meet is a biennial event.

The 5th edition of the event was originally planned for 2020 but postponed due to COVID-19. During the COVID years, we were unable to host the tournament, however we continued to work behind the scenes to progress the paper work for institutionalization of the ONSM with respect to the development of guiding principles, code of conduct, organizational structure, roles and responsibilities of committee members, and documentation of processes in the Tournament planning space.

Since the inception, the objectives have been geared towards communities and individuals:

- to improve health and fitness by promoting sporting events
- to provide a platform for organisations and individuals to connect and learn from each other
- to stimulate social harmony and interaction
- to inspire and support young sporting talent
- to promote business through partnerships and sponsorships
- to facilitate and build self-confidence and a healthy competitive spirit
- to encourage various sporting organisations to collaborate
- to encourage the younger generation to get involved and network with the previous generation through the means of sports and learn from their experiences
- to socialise and mingle with community sporting spirit.

It is hoped that this unique community initiative has the potential to spread over to all countries across the Oceania region (Australia, Fiji, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Nauru, New Zealand, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Island, Tonga, Tuvalu, and Vanuatu) and make a significant contribution in shaping multi-cultural landscape of the region.

The 6th edition of the ONSM tournament will be held in 2025 in Perth WA.

Team ACT will start preparation for the handover process to team WA by conducting an AGM by end of July 2023.

The team ACT looks forward to meeting you all in 2025.
